

## **DUNHAM HOMES: PRESERVED & NOT**

#### ARCHITECTURAL GENEALOGY?

Several sources have contributed material for what might be a brand new science, architectural genealogy: P. C. Alger of Derry, NH, Betty Brown of Littleton, CO, & Editor Phyllis Kitson -though this last resembles more archeological architectural genealogy, as you will see. photo of the Dunham-Richey house (below) was found by P. C. Alger in a newly published book (title unknown) at the Hunterden Co. Library in Flemington, NJ. The house was built by a Samuel Dunham who appears to be the Samuel Dunham (1730-1827)(5)(Deacon John 1, Benijah 2, Rev. Edmund 3, Rev. Jonathan 4), born in Piscataway, NJ. The date of this house isn't known, but while it looks as if it could have been built in the 1920's, it's clearly a lot older than that. Next in our tour of family homes is that of Hartwell Dunham (1822-1898) in Hopkins, MI, provided by Betty Brown. (See related article in this issue.) Finally, there is a fragment which Phyllis Kitson almost literally unearthed at the home of her 2nd cousin once removed Sue Andersen in Los Angeles. It was among Sue's old photos, but Sue didn't know who the picture portrayed -- or had once portrayed. After one look, Phyllis DID. She recognized her great grandparents, Maria Sands Dunham (lady in the middle, who has retained her head) & Samuel E. Dunham (1850-1915)((9)(Deacon John 1, John 2, John 3, Ebenezer 4, Ebenezer 5, Jonathan 6, Ralph 7, Francis S. 8). The woman on the left would be one of their daughters, but we'll never know which one. The Dunham home was on Oakwood Blvd. on Chicago's South Side. While not much of it can be seen, there's some good detail of the porch & railing, & Phyllis (to p. 2)

#### HARTWELL B. DUNHAM Elizabeth E. (Betty) Brown

This is the home of my great great grandfather, Hartwell B. DUNHAM (1822-1898), when he lived there and as I found it in our time. Now called Ivy Acres in Hopkins, Michigan, it is the present home of a great grandson, Thomas O. MILLS. Hartwell, the son of David DUNHAM and \_\_\_\_\_? \_\_\_ PURSON, married Julia Ann HURLBURT (1823-1897) in 1845 (exact date and place unknown, probably Michigan but possibly New York). Their daughter, Amelia R. DUNHAM (1848-1867), married Albert Seneca DUNHAM (1837-1901) in Cooper, Michigan 25 DEC 1865. He was the son of Seneca DUNHAM (1807-1887) born in Casenova, New York and the grandson of Edward DUNHAM (1753-1844), a Revolutionary War Patriot born in Great Nine Partners, Dutchess County, New York. That is the name of a land patent; there is no place of that name in Dutchess County today. I descend from Edward's second wife, Mary (RIDLEY) DANIELS (1766-?), widow of Jacob DANIELS or DANNALS. Edward was said to have been one of 8 sons, 4 of whom were Patriots and 4 of whom were Tories (first names unknown). What heartaches there must have been in that family!

HARTWELL B. DUNHAM (from p. 2) I am searching for his parents & 1st family, & I am still trying to find out how Amelia & Albert, my great-grandparents, said to be cousins, were related. That puzzle is where I started my research in 1984. Despite my success in finding Mayflower Passenger ancestors, Revolutionary War Patriots, my cousin Tom Mills with a great portrait of Hartwell Dunham & the early picture of his farmhouse, I am

STILL stumped where I started. I found that, although descendants of both families lived within 50 miles of each other & knew the others existed, neither side knew how they connected. I remember when I was a child visiting in Michigan with my mother, we would first visit a cousin on one side. Mother would ask about the ones she knew & try to explain how she was related to the other side. Then we would visit a cousin on the other side. Mother would ask there about the ones she knew & try to explain how she was related to the other side. They were all interested, but didn't get together. In 1988 when I was visiting Cousin Flossie (widow of Albert's grandson, Charles Dunham) I took her to meet Cousin Gertrude (Yates) MacDonald, a granddaughter of Hartwell, then in a nursing home in Plainwell, MI. Today's families both want to know where the connection lies, but neither side knows enough to find it-- & the families live so close to each other! Our search for a family Bible has been unsuccessful. I intend to look harder for



land & probate records. From a scrambled family tradition, I expect that one or both Dunham lines will lead me to Deacon John Dunham of Plymouth Colony. If anyone has information that can help or steer me to the right sources to solve my puzzle, I shall be most grateful.
