## A Dunham-Coryell Line

An article in the Winter 2023 issue of **American Ancestors**, Vol. 23, #4, pp 27-31 prompts me to include the following article in this issue of the DGRA newsletter. I did the research on this Dunham line in 2003-4 but I was never able to definitely connect these Dunhams to the possible line of Deacon John Dunham through his son Benajah Dunham. Therefore, I did not include this line on the Dunham web site [www.dunham-singletary.org](http://www.dunham-singletary.org) . I do feel that it is important to preserve the information about the several generations covered in this article on the DGRA web site and the article that appeared in the Winter issue of **American Ancestors** is a perfect example of a reason for doing so.

The article in **American Ancestors**, which is published quarterly by the New England Historic Genealogical Society, is entitled **The Surprising Origins of the Coryell Family of Colonial New Jersey** by Lea Coryell, Michael Waas and Adam Brown. The article discusses work that the Avotaynu Research Partnership is doing to prove that Abraham Coriell who came to Piscataway, New Jersey by 1702 was descended from a Sephardic Jewish family. The Avotaynu Research Partnership is conducting an academic study that has been DNA testing Jews worldwide to learn the genetic markings of their origins.

From the article, “Jacob Curiel was born in Coimbra, Portugal, on September 26, 1587, as Duarte Nunes da Costa. He eventually oversaw a family trading empire that dealt in such far-flung products as Brazilian sugar and Indian diamonds. Fleeing Portugal one step ahead of the Inquisition he eventually landed in Hamburg.” As Jacob Curiel, he died in Hamburg on April 3, 1664. While Jacob never came to America, he was a large shareholder of the Dutch West India Company. The intervening generations are unknown however it is proven by DNA results that Jacob Curiel was an ancestor of Abraham Coriell of Piscataway, Middlesex County, New Jersey.

The genealogical research that I did in 2003-4 was on the Dunham families of Middlesex County, New Jersey who moved first about 1801 to Ovid, Seneca County, New York and then by 1811 to Hector, Schuyler Co. New York and later to Howard Township, Steuben County, New York.

### FIRST GENERATION

1. **Thomas Dunham**, the first of this line we can locate, was born in New Jersey about 1766 and died in Howard Township, Steuben County, New York in 1845 aged 79 years. This Thomas Dunham married in 1791 to **Ann Carrell/Coryell**. She was born in New Jersey about 1764 and she died in Steuben in 1843 aged 79 years. They are both buried in a small cemetery near Buena Vista, Howard Twp. Steuben Co. NY I realize that Ann Coryell will not help those studying the Y-DNA of the Coryell line, but Ann did have brothers who followed this same migration path. In fact; the 1810 Census of Ovid, Seneca County, New York shows Abraham Coryell and Elias Coryell both of whom I believe were brothers of Ann (Coryell) Dunham. This census also shows a David A. Coryell over 45 years old, and a younger man, James Coryell. In addition

there is Ezeriah Dunham (or Azeriah Dunham which is a name associated with the descendants of Benajah<sup>2</sup> Dunham, and circumstantial evidence that this Dunham family does descend from Benajah<sup>2</sup> Dunham) and Thomas Dunham who married Ann Coryell.

## SECOND GENERATION

2. **Samuel<sup>2</sup> Dunham** (Thomas<sup>1</sup>) b. 1792 in NJ; d. 7 Feb. 1860 age 68 yrs. His wife in 1850 was **Lydia Stout**. She was probably his only wife, and mother of all children.

A descendant of this family, Olive Richardson, says this Samuel was b. abt. Aug. 1791 and d. 7 February 1860 age 68 yrs. 6 mos. 3 days at Hector, Schuyler Co. NY. Samuel married **Lydia Stout**. She was b. in NJ; d. 24 September 1875 age 84 yrs. 10 mos. 4 days. Samuel and Lydia are buried in Hector Union Cemetery, Bennettsburg, Schuyler Co. NY. Samuel's will dated, 22 Dec. 1859 and petition for probate 17 March 1860 states heirs "all of full age & residing Hector" Schuyler Co. [Schuyler Co. Surr. Recs 1:279]

When I read Jeffrey and Joann's introductory notes to the last Newsletter, I knew immediately that I had to share them with my cousin Jay Dunham, a pilot in our family. He wrote back with a "small world" connection story, which he is graciously permitting me to share with you:

I did a quick read and was impressed by the contents of the newsletter. The meticulous work in documenting those family lines must take a special passion/patience. Although I did not know him, I searched FMI re James Gilmore Dunham:

Turns out James graduated from USAF Pilot Training in 1954, which is 30 years prior to my own graduation from USAF Pilot Training – at the same location – Williams AFB, Arizona. We flew over the same cotton fields, orange groves, canyon country, and occasionally over the same Phoenix metro area. So, it was there at “Willy” that James and I both ultimately earned our prized silver Air Force pilot wings. It is nice to know “we Dunham boys” shared that common experience – albeit three decades apart!

Jay's father was my Uncle John, who served in the Air Force during the Korean War. As children, whenever we saw a small V-shaped jet flying over our heads, we would shout out, "Uncle John plane" !

My first memories of Jay are of visiting their apartment in Fayetteville NC, a military town with Fort Bragg and Pope Air Field nearby. Instead of "Captain Kangaroo," Jay was watching "The Soldier" on TV who sang:

"Marching, marching, round about the school room.  
Heads are up, eyes ahead, like the soldiers on parade.  
Marching, marching, do not fall behind.  
Keep in step as we turn in line."

We joined in and sang as we marched around the living room.

After High School, Jay attended USAFA (the US Air Force Academy) and was later stationed in Japan, where he met his wife-to-be, Vicki, who was a school teacher on the base. One day Vicki was "kidnapped" from the class she was teaching and Jay whisked her away for a "top-secret" flight to a tropical island 67 miles west of Okinawa. While flying home after a day of sun and sand, they spotted a secret message on the west coast of Okinawa:



Jay had coordinated the beach message with a friend, with the planned message being, “Vicki: Will you marry me? Jay,” but the garden shop's tarp supply was a little low, so Jay's friend had to improvise and shorten the message. By the way, Vicki said, “Yes.”

Jay and Vicki raised four children at Edwards AFB in California. Their third child, Holt, has wanted to be a pilot since he was four years old. He is now an Aero major at USAFA, becoming a third-generation Airman while also serving as a soaring instructor pilot, teaching other USAFA cadets how to fly gliders. Like his father, and also like James Gilmore Dunham, Holt hopes to be selected for USAF Pilot Training – only in his case there won't be a chance to train in those same desert skies since Williams AFB was closed by Congress in 1993.

Isaac enlisted as a private in Co E, 31<sup>st</sup> Marine Infantry Regiment during the Civil War, at Patten, Penobscot, ME, 11 Mar 1864 and was mustered into the service on 17 Apr 1864.<sup>[12,13]</sup> The Regiment left Maine 18 April and was attached to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Brigade, 2nd Division, IX Corps, Army of the Potomac. The 31<sup>st</sup> commenced active campaigning on 4 May 1864 and took its 1<sup>st</sup> casualties 2 days later. By 12 June it was engaged in the Siege of Petersburg, VA.<sup>[14]</sup>

Isaac died from chronic diarrhea while in the General Hospital located at City Point, Prince George Co., VA during the Siege of Petersburg.<sup>[15]</sup> City Point was the location where, General Ulysses S. Grant's headquarters was located and it is now part of Hopewell, Prince George Co., VA.<sup>[16]</sup>
