## From the President

I exchanged several email messages with the DGRA President Jeff Dunham over the past week about his letter for the Newsletter and then dealing with the power outages and damage caused by the Blizzard that struck the Portland, Oregon area.

## The Dunham line of Rose Marie (Mushel) Ployhar

### Generations 1, 2 & 3

The below line of Rose Marie Mushel descends from Nathaniel <sup>4</sup> Dunham, (Joseph, <sup>3,4</sup> Deacon John <sup>1</sup>) and Easter Partridge. He is the same person as Nathaniel 1<sup>st</sup> in the article by Rosemari Finter published in The American Genealogist v. 62, p. 17-18, shown as #6 Nathaniel Dunham, 1<sup>st</sup> of Mansfield. As stated in her article on p. 17 "The fact that Esther Partridge's husband was designated as "1<sup>st</sup>" in the marriage record indicates that he was older than Nathaniel <sup>5</sup>, who was called "Jr." and who was born in 1722."

In research by Gratia Dunham Mahony only the first two children of Joseph <sup>3</sup> and Bethia (Chase) Dunham are given in the vital Records. Joseph <sup>3</sup> Dunham was a house carpenter (house builder) and was found in the records in Norton, (see following). [House builders at that time moved around to wherever their services were needed.] Gratia believes that Nathaniel <sup>4</sup> was probably born in Norton but not sure of the exact year -- please see the arrangement of the children that I assembled when I first began research on this line (my line comes from Stephen <sup>4</sup> Dunham b. 5 May 1709). Most of this is only background information for your information but it does connect this family to Norton. It also answers the question posed by Rosemari Finter that Nathaniel 1<sup>st</sup> was older than Nathaniel <sup>5</sup> Jr. b. 1722. And it shows how Nathaniel 1<sup>st</sup> could have "of Norton" if he was born there.

### Generation 4

**281. Nathaniel <sup>4</sup> Dunham** (Joseph <sup>3,2</sup> John <sup>1</sup>) was born before 1721, a son of Joseph <sup>3</sup> Dunham and Bethia Chase.<sup>[1]</sup> This is the Nathaniel Dunham known as Nathaniel 1<sup>st</sup> of Norton and Mansfield.<sup>[2]</sup> While we do not have an exact birth or death date for Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> of Norton, he would have been born before Nathaniel <sup>5</sup> Dunham, Jr. son of Nathaniel <sup>4,3</sup>, Joseph <sup>2</sup> John <sup>1</sup> Dunham). This Nathaniel <sup>5</sup> Dunham, Jr. was born in Norton 20 June 1722. <sup>[3]</sup> There was a

Nathaniel Dunham who died in Mansfield, Bristol, MA, 14 March 1796. but that date is for Nathaniel Dunham, Jr. [3]

While we do not have an exact birth or death date for Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> of Norton, he would have been born before Nathaniel <sup>5</sup> Dunham, Jr. son of Nathaniel <sup>4,3</sup>, Joseph <sup>2</sup> John <sup>1</sup> Dunham). This Nathaniel <sup>5</sup> Dunham, Jr. was born in Norton 20 June 1722. [4] Also see TAG v. 62, p. 15 for discussion by Dr. David Green and the author of the article, Rosemari Finter of the fact that “if Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> was older than Nathaniel Jr. – and I’m sure that he was – it follows that Nathaniel 1<sup>st</sup> was born before 1722.” [5, 6]

We know from land records that Joseph <sup>3</sup> Dunham, house carpenter, was living in Norton between about 1711/12 to about 1724 when he is living in Edgartown. It is likely that several of his children were born in Norton. Please refer to the narrative under #48. Joseph <sup>3</sup> Dunham, father of Nathaniel <sup>4</sup> Dunham 1<sup>st</sup>. If Nathaniel <sup>4</sup> Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> was born in Norton before 1722, then it is logical that he would be called Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> of Norton.

**Esther Partridge** m. Nathaniel Dunham 21 Dec 1757 in Norton.

From the Court of General Sessions ... September ... Ninth Day ... 1760, p. 207; “Esther Dunham Late Esther Partridge appeared ... while a single Woman was guilty of fornication ... fine of Twenty shillings....” [9]

Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> married (probably as his second wife), probably in Raynham (given on Norton Vital Records as Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> intent 21 December 1757 m. 6 January 1757/8 **Esther Partridge** of Raynham. [7, 8] They resided in that part of Norton which became the district of Mansfield Ma. in 1770, and the town of Mansfield Ma. in 1775.

Esther was b. abt. 1730; d. Savoy, Berkshire, MA, 15 May 1807 ae: 77 yrs. She was bur. in Spruce Corner Cemetery, Savoy. [10]

Nathaniel Dunham 1<sup>st</sup> would have been between 36 and 42 years old at the time of his marriage to Esther Partridge, thus we should consider that he may have had an earlier (unknown) wife and may even have had children by her.

- 281.4. iv. **Job<sup>5</sup> Dunham** b. prob in Mansfield, Sep 1768; d. Savoy, 17 Nov 1859;<sup>[23]</sup> m. Mansfield, 13 Dec 1792, **Elisabeth William**, (4<sup>th</sup>)(both of Mansfield),<sup>[24]</sup> the dau. of Elijah Williams and Elizabeth Bates. She was b. in Mansfield, 21 Jun 1767;<sup>[25]</sup> d. Savoy, 18 Sep 1833.<sup>[26]</sup> Both Job and Elizabeth were bur. in Spruce Corner Cemetery, Savoy<sup>[27, 28]</sup> Job m. 2<sup>nd</sup> 1835, **Lydia (Handy) Jenks**, widow of Israel Jenks. Lydia was bur in Mineral Spring Cemetery, Pawtucket, Providence, RI and had 8 children with Israel.<sup>[29]</sup>

**281.1. Caleb<sup>5</sup> Dunham**, (Nathaniel<sup>4</sup>, Joseph<sup>3,2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>), b. Norton, Bristol, MA. 27 Mar 1760;<sup>[2]</sup> d. West Haven, Rutland, VT, abt. 1825;<sup>[3]</sup> m. Sarah Trembling/Tombling/Trombling, dau. of Abijah Tambling and Phebe Sanford. She was b. Windham Co., CT, 13 Oct 1768; d. West Haven, 21 Oct 1822.<sup>[5]</sup>

From Massachusetts, U.S., Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War; v. 5 p.39;  
Caleb Dunham, Mansfield. Private, Capt. Josiah Smith's Co. Col. Josiah Whitney's Regt. Enlisted May 27 1776; service to Dec. 1 1776, 6 mos. 6 days; company raised for defense of town and harbor of Boston.

Private in Capt. Benjamin Bates Co. Col. Abiel Mitchel's Regt; enlisted July 28 1780; discharged Oct. 31 1780; service 3 mos. 6 days; company raised to reinforce Continental Army for 3 months.

Private, Capt. Isaac Hodges Co. Col. George William's Regt; service from Sept. 25 1777 to Oct. 31 1777, 1 mo. 6 days, on a secret expedition; roll sworn to at Norton; also, Capt. Israel Trow's Co., Col. John Daggett's Regt; entered service Jan 12 1778; discharged March 31, 1778; service, 2 mos. 20 days; company drafted to serve under Maj. Gen. Spencer at Rhode Island for 3 months from Jan. 1 1778.

Also in Vol. 5; p. 868 under Caleb Donham, Mansfield. Private, Capt. Samuel White's Co. Col. Thomas Carpenter's Regt; enlisted Aug. 19 1778; discharged Sept. 8 1778; service 21 days, on an expedition to Rhode Island.

1800 United States Federal Census; Orwell, Rutland, VT - 20010-21010 as Demham  
Caleb is age 26-45 (he would be 40 years old) with 2 males under 10; 2 females under 10, one female 10-16, and one female 26-45.

1810 United States Federal Census; West Haven, Rutland, VT  
1 male under 10, 1 male 10-16, 1 male 16-26, 1 male over 45; and 1 female under 10, 2 f. 10-16, 1 f. 16-26 and 1 f. 26-45.

1830 United States Federal Census; West Haven, Rutland, VT  
2 males under 5, 2 male 5-10, 1 Male 30-40; and 1 female 20-30. This would be the family of Caleb Dunham Jr. b. Oct 1790 as both his parents were dead.

Info. from Olive Richardson:

Samuel Jennings had a tavern at Lockport, Niagara, NY, 1820-35, then the family moved west to Illinois and Michigan. Betsey and Samuel Jennings had children, and a grandson named Edwin Brizez Jennings who d. 11 Oct. 1923 in Chicago IL. The Probate Court of Cook Co. IL, File # 92985 has seven volumes of testimony and evidence relating to a hearing in Oct. 1924 "to determine heirship". There were numerous claims to his estate.<sup>[11]</sup>

Wyocena, Columbia, WI<sup>[19]</sup> and was bur. in Hillside Cemetery, Columbus.<sup>[20]</sup> Hannah and Hehemiah were the parents of 5 sons and 1 daughter<sup>[21]</sup> and were bur. in Hillside Cemetery, Columbus.<sup>[22]</sup>

He had been elected as a state senator in 1894.<sup>[15]</sup> The Probate of his estate took place in Anoka County, from 9 May 1898 to 28 Nov 1899. The Guardianship his children, Marion Dunham and Dewitt C. Dunham took place on 8 Jun 1898 also in Anoka County.<sup>[16]</sup>

Dewitt was found in the U.S. Federal Census records for 1850 in Brownhelm, Lorain, OH., 1860 in Brooklyn, Green, Wisconsin, 1870, 1880, 1890 in Anoka and he was found in the 1875 and 1885 Minnesota State Census. Ruth was found in the Census Records as a widow in Anoka from 1900 to 1950.<sup>[17, 18]</sup> In the 1880 U.S. Census the parents of Margaret indicate being b. in England and Ireland.<sup>[19]</sup>

His obituary can be found in several newspapers from Minnesota and each contains slightly different information on his life.<sup>[20]</sup> The Estate of DeWitt Clinton Dunham was filed in the Probate Court, Anoka County, MN, 9 May 1898.<sup>[21]</sup>
